Florida Friendly Plants for the Three Foot Areas

We want everyone to have great looking plantings, but more important, it is essential that the plantings be "Florida Friendly". This means that they will not cause harm to the environment, and our buildings and drainage systems won't be harmed by aggressive roots.

The following plants are approved for the three foot area. Other plants may also be appropriate but will have to be pre-approved by the Board's Grounds Chair.

The approved plants are listed below, our guidelines are drawn from the Guide.
